


Identifying Ultimate Beneficial Owners: Why is it so challenging?

The key obstacles in identifying and verifying Ultimate Beneficial Owners (UBOs).



Complex corporate structures

Shell companies, trusts, and layered entities are often set up to **obscure who truly owns a business,** making it difficult to trace the real owners.



Cross-jurisdictional issues

Different countries have different rules for revealing who owns a company, and some jurisdictions make it **easier to hide beneficial ownership.**



Limited access to reliable data

Public records about company ownership may be incomplete, outdated, or even inaccurate. Some jurisdictions don't require regular updates, making the data unreliable.



Use of nominees

Nominee directors and shareholders are often used to **disguise the true ownership**. While legal, it can make it harder to track down the actual beneficial owner.



Lack of standardisation

There's no universal definition of what defines a UBO, or how ownership should be disclosed. Ownership disclosure requirements can vary widely across jurisdictions.
